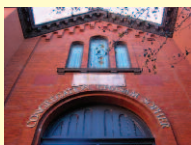


INSIDER TOURS OF THE LOWER EAST SIDE

- Visit the magnificently restored *Congregation Chasam Sopher*, the oldest continually operating synagogue in New York City.
- Browse *Streit's Matzoh Factory Outlet*, the only family-owned and operated matzoh company in the U.S.
- Nosh on irresistible confections at *Economy Candy*. (Food costs not included).

- View the exterior of *Beth Hamedrash Hagadol*, former home of the largest Russian-Jewish Orthodox congregation in the United States.
- Visit the beautiful *Bialystoker Synagogue*, the largest active orthodox congregation on the Lower East Side today.
- Learn about *Shtiebl Row* and visit *Congregation Beth Hachasidim De Polen*, an original 19th century shtiebl (a one room prayer or study hall).
- Discuss the significance of the *Henry Street Settlement* and *Lower East Side mikvah*.
